ISIL Second Winter Course on International Trade Law 2 January to 6 January 2012

The Indian Society of International Law (ISIL) was founded in 1959 at the initiative of Shri V. K. Krishna Menon and was inaugurated in the same year by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of independent India, with the objective to "foster nation wide the study and development of International Law and to encourage the comparative study of the application of International Law in other States". The ISIL has been publishing the Indian Journal of International Law since its inception, which has attained a high standard and is held in high esteem the world over. The ISIL has also a good library, which is used by scholars from all over India. It organizes annual conferences and seminars on international issues of contemporary interest. Finally, and equally important, it conducts and promotes independent research on issues of International Law. The teaching wing of the ISIL- the Indian Academy of International Law & Diplomacy, runs post-graduate diploma courses in various branches of international law. The ISIL organises every year a Summer Course in international law to bring to you the current developments and their importance in the field.

From 2010 academic year, the ISIL is organising a one-week winter course every year on specific areas of international law viz., international environmental law, international trade law, intellectual property rights law, international human rights law etc.


We are pleased to announce the **ISIL Second Winter Course on International Trade Law** which will commence from **Monday, 2 January 2012, to Friday 6 January 2012**. The topics will relate to: Theories of International Trade, International Sales Contract, Carriage of Goods by Sea, New International Economic Order, Evolution of Bretton Wood Institutions and Its Role and Challenges, Historical Evolution of GATT and WTO, MFN and National Treatment in the WTO System and Its Status in International Law, Custom Valuations, Voluntary Export Restraint, Safeguard and Anti-dumping Measures in the WTO, Subsidies and Countervailing Duties Agreements, TRIPS, TRIMS, GATS etc and International Monetary Fund and World Bank Institutions. Compliance and settlement of disputes in trade law will be priority to discuss in the Winter Course. India's positions on trade issues will be analysed and discussed with the participants.

The Society will endeavour to make available the best expertise available in the respective fields as course instructors, which would include noted academicians, governmental, non-governmental and UN officials etc.

The course will comprise classroom lectures, discussion, counseling and library consultation, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays. The course fee would be Rs. 2,000/- for students and Rs. 2,500/- for teachers and lawyers. Maximum 300 participants can be admitted on the basis of first-cum-first serve. Demand drafts shall be drawn in favour of the Indian Society of International Law. At the end of the course a certificate of participation will be given to all the participants.
