BOOK PROPOSAL

The Indian Society of International Law (ISIL) has completed sixty years of its existence. Its role in the post-colonial context in shaping new international law is well-known. Development and dissemination of international law, mainly from the Indian and developing countries' perspectives, remain its primary objectives. In order to fulfil this objective it has been bringing out Indian Journal of International Law and several other publications in all these years. Several books (both edited and individual contributions) have also been published. In many ways ISIL today is at crossroads considering the evolution and reach of international law both within and outside India. ISIL, therefore, needs to evaluate its role and be more responsive to the emerging international legal regimes/principles in the era of global concerns. It is time that we critically evaluate its rationale for existence and dealing with future challenges. It is appropriate that we propose to bring out an edited volume on the role of Indian Society of International Law in the development and dissemination of international law. Broad guidelines for the contributors are suggested below:

- Contributions could be invited from all our life members;
- 2. Contributions from non-life members working in the field of international law could also be solicited:
- Contributions should primarily relate to the work of the ISIL, in particular, the academic and 3. practical orientations as reflected in the last six decades preferably within Indian Journal of International Law (IJIL) such as (a) Role of ISIL in Development of International Law; (b) History of International Law – from the Indian and Asian perspective; (c) Indian/Asian/African approach to international law; (d) India and the United Nations; (e) India and other international organisations; (d) India and International adjudication; (e) Indian State practice in international law; (f) Role of IJIL in contributing to the development of international law; (g) Law of the Sea; and (h) International Trade and Economic Law Regimes. These items are indicative only.
- Each contribution should be limited to 10000 words (inclusive of footnotes). An abstract of 500 words should be submitted by **15th July 2022**; 4.
- A sub-committee constituted by the Research and Publications Committee will evaluate and 6. select the abstracts.
- Final articles shall be submitted by 15th September 2022. Articles will be peer reviewed by a panel of reviewers.
- Publication process of the book shall be completed by 15th December 2022. 9
- Consideration may be given to publish this volume with a reputed publishing house.
