ISIL 23rd Summer Course on International Law 2 June to 13 June 2025 (Physical Classes)

The Indian Society of International Law (ISIL) was founded in 1959 at the initiative of Shri V. K. Krishna Menon and was inaugurated in the same year by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of independent India, with the objective to "foster nationwide the study and development of International Law and to encourage the comparative study of the application of International Law in other States". The ISIL has been publishing the *Indian Journal of International Law* since its inception, which has attained a high standard and is held in high esteem the world over. The ISIL has also a good library, which is used by scholars from all over India. It organizes annual conferences and seminars on international issues of contemporary interest. Finally, and equally important, it conducts and promotes independent research on issues of International Law. The teaching wing of the ISIL- *the Indian Academy of International Law & Diplomacy*, runs post-graduate diploma courses in various branches of international law.


Since 2001, the ISIL has been organizing a Summer Course in international law that aims to bring current developments and practice in international law to interested participants.

We are pleased to announce that the **ISIL 23rd Summer Course** will commence from **Monday, 2 June 2025, to Friday, 13 June 2025**. The topics will relate to Public International Law, Private International Law, International Institutions, International Trade and Business Law, International Environmental Law, Intellectual Property Rights, International Human Rights Law, International Humanitarian Law, Refugee Law, and International Criminal Law and Space Laws.

The Society will endeavour to make available the best expertise available in the respective fields as course instructors, including noted academicians, governmental, non-governmental and UN officials etc.

The course will comprise **physical** lectures and discussions, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The course fee would be Rs. 4,000/- for students and Rs. 4,500/- for teachers, officials and lawyers. A maximum 300 participants can be admitted based on first-cum-first serve. Demand drafts shall be drawn in favour of the Indian Society of International Law. Online registration is also placed at ISIL website [isil-aca.org]. At the end of the course, a certificate of attendance will be given to all the participants.
